months to hatch



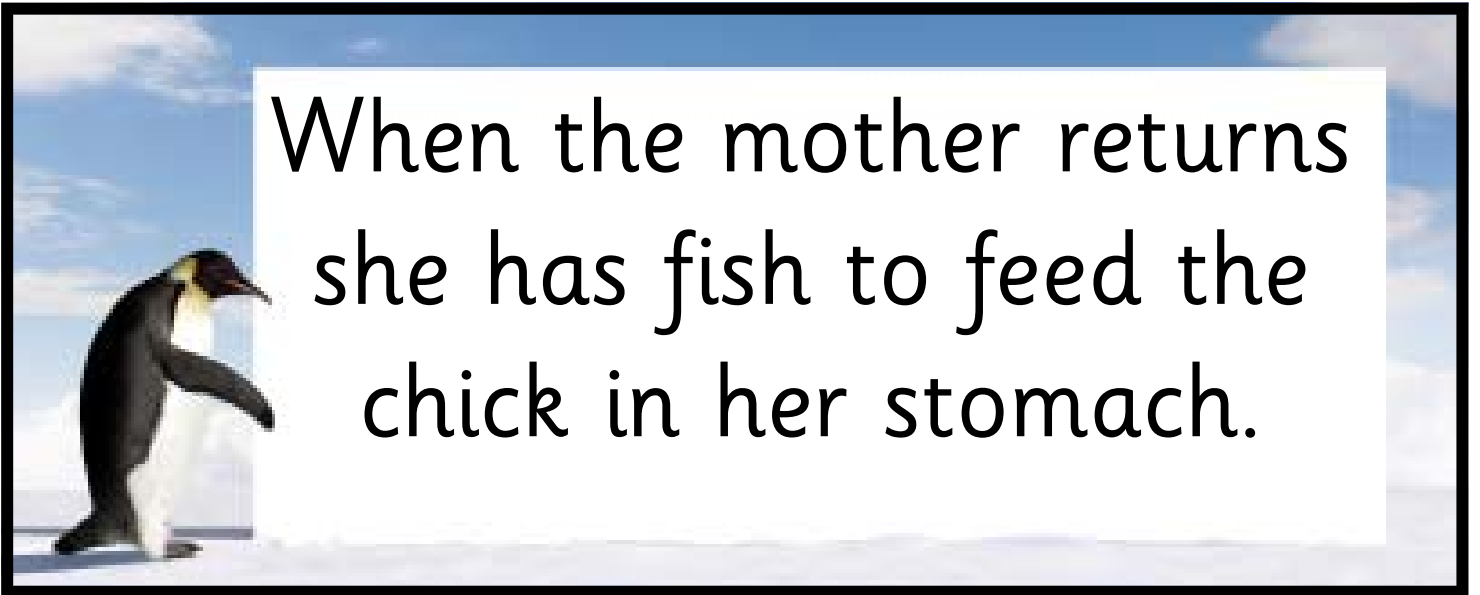
A male Emperor

egg on his feet.



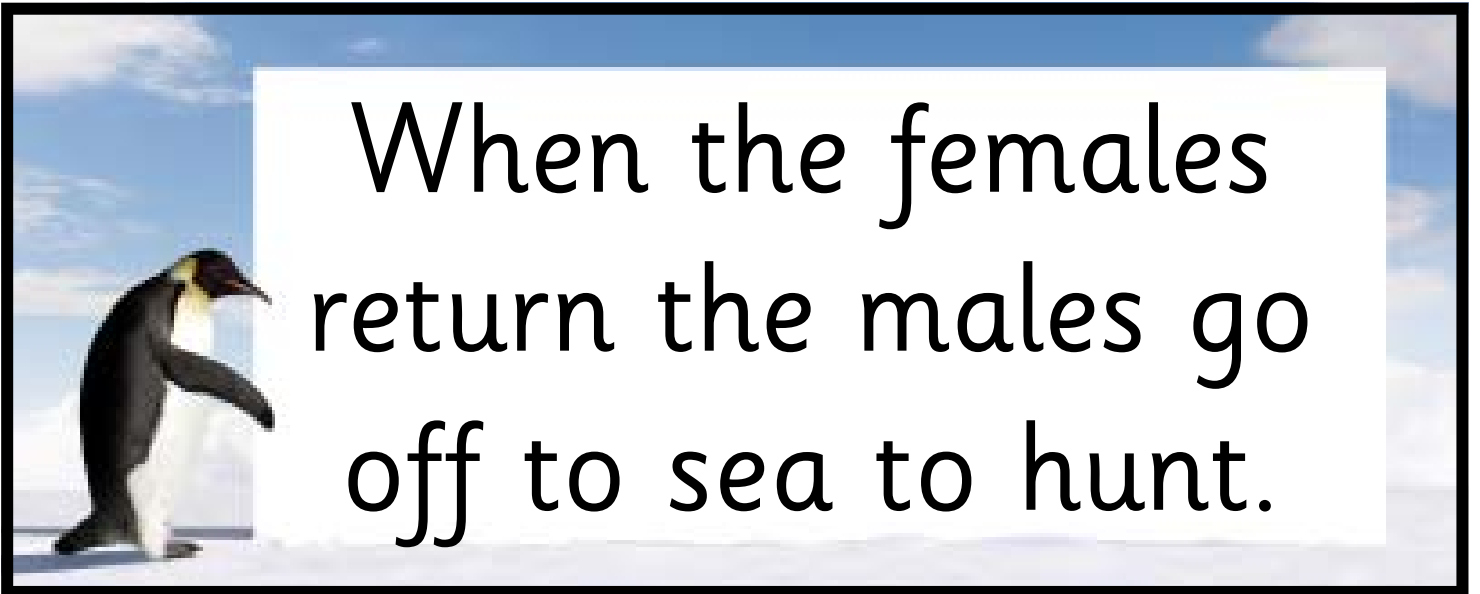
The penguin chick
